



The project is located in Guatapé- Antioquia, Colombia, just two hours away from Medellín, a place with natural potential for ecological tourism development

It consists of a series of refuges immersed within a natural landscape which offers visitors an escape from the daily monotony of the agitated city life.



The challenge of this project was to have an architecture where the priority was to cherish the concept and idea of preserving nature; the outward appearance becomes secondary issue.









By looking at the building, it is clear that the design is a response to the site's natural environment, with the building's form and materials reflecting the surrounding landscape.



The use of materials like concrete and metal, combined with the building's form, creates a sense of continuity with the natural environment, while the large windows and balconies provide a connection to the outdoors.
