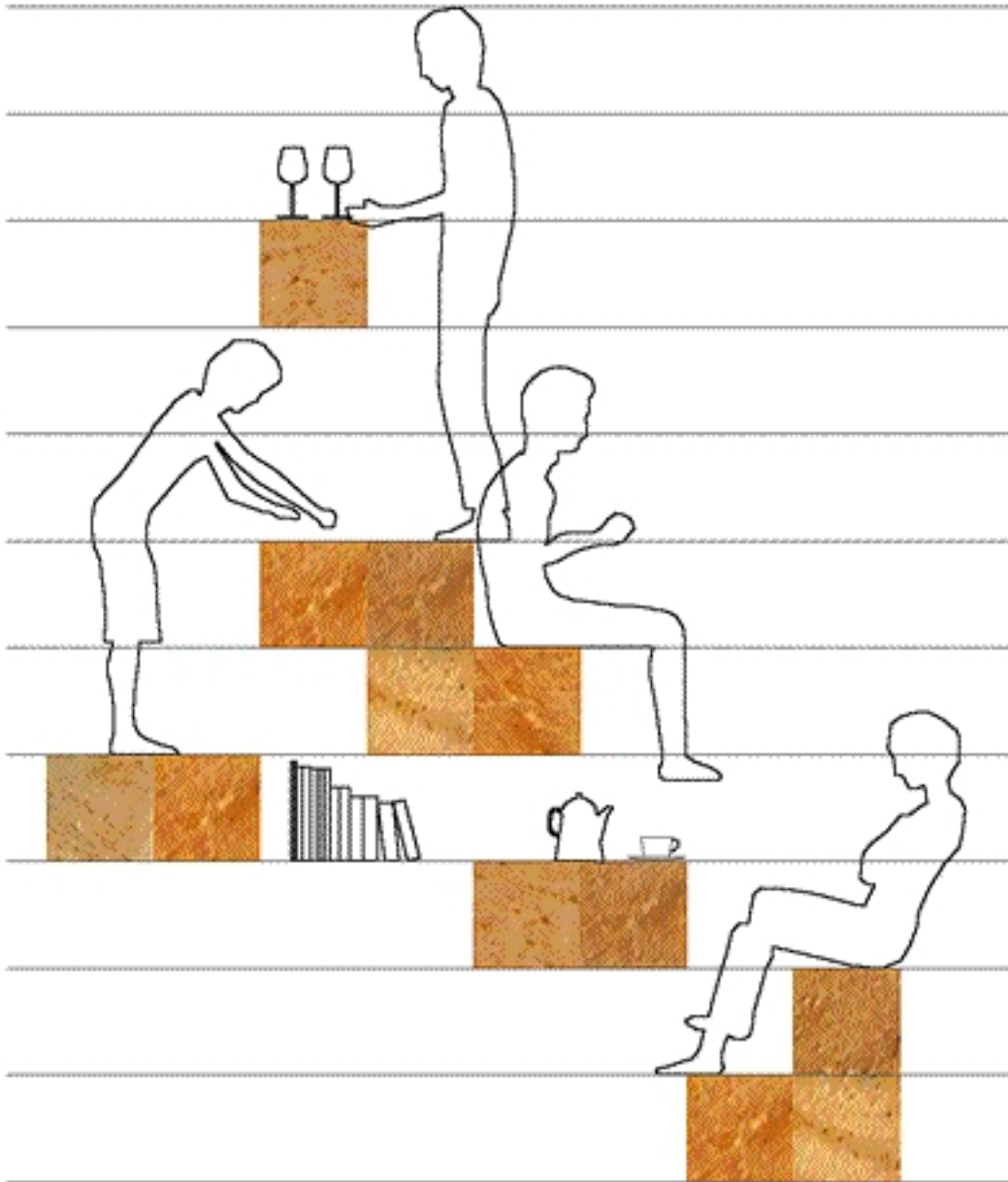
**In that perspective, Sou Fujimoto built this prototypical project that kept him thinking of the primary functions of the house.**

At the end of the process appears a prototypical place before architecture became architecture.»
