



Located just along the Ill River that flows across Alsace in the far-eastern regions of France, the prestigious Auberge de l'III, held by Haerberlin family, has welcomed gourmets since 1879. Now, with the family's 5th generation behind the oven, the Auberge offers its services within four dining rooms.
